She finished with 302 in her KCPEs (primary school certificate which is out of 500) and had been being allowed to attend primary school for free in Sekenani as her family have no money.

Her secondary education costs KES 56,000 per term (3 terms in one year). That is approximately US\$630 at today's exchange rate (subject to fluctuation).



ELIUD MATHU



Mathu is six years old and is the third of four siblings. All four of them are in the same children's home and have been there since November 2012. Mathu is a lively boy who laughs a lot. Mathu loves to get attention but he complains when things are not going the way he wants it. Mathu is in nursery at school. His goals for this year are to stop wetting the bed and to learn to share toys and other things.

Half his primary education is sponsored but he needs the other half of approximately 20 Euros per month to be covered.
